Precise Text of the Proposed Amendments of the POTOMAC RIVER FISHERIES COMMISSION REGULATIONS

February 16, 2007

Shaded = New Text Strikethrough = Deleted Text

1. **Reg. III, Sec. 11(b)** – To clarify the method of measurement of fish.

Measurement shall be the greatest distance in a straight line from the tip of the nose snout to the end of the caudal fin or tail in a natural state, excluding the tail filament of black sea bass. No person shall alter the natural state of any species of fish listed in (a) above such that its length cannot be measured.

2. **Reg. VII, Sec. 2(a)** – To increase the minimum size limit on hard crabs from April 1st to July 9th from 5" to 5 ½".

It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, keep in floats, or have in possession any:

- (1) hard crabs, except mature female crabs, less than 5 ½ inches from April 1 through July 9 and hard crabs, except mature female crabs, less than 5 ½ inches from July 10 through the end of the season.
- (2) peeler crabs less than 3 ½ inches.
- (3) sponge crabs, spawn crab, blooming female crab, mother crab or the female crab from which the egg pouch or bunion has been removed of any size.

Once taken hard, peeler and soft shell crabs shall be kept separate from each other.
