
# PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE REGULATIONS of the POTOMAC RIVER FISHERIES COMMISSION May 15, 2008

Pursuant to the Potom ac River Compact of 1958, as dul y enacted into law by the General Assemblies of the States of Maryland and Virginia and duly ratified by the Congress of the United States of America, the Potomac River Fisheries Commission hereby proposes to amend and/or adopt regulations as follows, so as:

- 1. To amend **Reg. VII, Sec. 5(b)** to enable the Commission to issue Orders to set commercial crabbing time limits for specified time of day and/or day-of-week, for the entire season or parts thereof, for all or only specified life stages and/or sexes—and may be different for specific areas—of the river. Adoption of this amendment may result in change(s) to the time limits for this year and future years.
- 2. To amend **Reg. I, Sec. 2(d)(3)** to enable the Commission to issue Orders to set a lower limit on the number of pots that may be set per license. Such limits may be for the entire season or only specific period(s) of time, and/or for all or only specific areas of the river. A doption of this amendment may result in change(s) to the number of pots that may be set for this year and future years.
- 3. To amend **Reg. VII**, **Sec. 4(a)** to enable the Commission to issue Orders to set the c rab season dates. Such date(s) may be the same or different for various gears, for all or only specified life stages and/or sexes. Adoption of this amendment may result in change(s) to the season dates for this year and future years.
- 4. To amend **Reg. VII, Sec. 2(a)** *Option one:* to establish a 5.5" m inimum size limit on hard crab, except for mature females, all year and establish a 6.5" maximum size limit on mature female crabs. *Option two:* to enable the Commission to issue Orders to set cra b size limits. Such limit(s) may be for the entire season or only specified period(s) of time, for all or only specified life stages and/or sexes. Adoption of *option 2* of this amendment may result in change(s) to the size limits for this year and future years.
- 5. To amend **Reg. I, Sec. 2(d)(1)** to require the crab pot licensee to be aboard the boat whenever the crab pots are set, fished or removed.
- 6. To adopt **Reg. I, Sec. 2(d)(2)** to provide for a tem porary designated fishermen exemption to **Reg. I, Sec. 2(d)(1)**.
- 7. To adopt **Reg. VII, Sec. 5(e)** to prohibit any crab pots in waters greater than 30 feet MLW and in the area bounded by a straight line between the federally maintained navigational aids R N #10, R N #12, R N # 14, G C # 13, G C #11, a point 500 yards due north of Ragged Point Light and R N # 10 the point of beginning.
- 8. To amend **Reg. VII, Sec. 6(b)** to increase the hard crab pot cull ring size from 2 3/16" to 2 ½" (note the 2 5/16" ring remains unchanged), increase the peeler pot a nd peeler trap cull ring size from 1 ½" to 2 3/16" and require all cull rings to be open at all times. (effective 2009)
- 9. To adopt **Reg. VI, Sec. 4(f)** to prohibit recreational crabbing from sunset to one (1) hour before sunrise, except for person(s) using dip nets and/or hand lines from the shore or a pier.
- 10. To adopt **Reg. VI, Sec. 4(g)** to prohibit recreational crabbers from taking any female hard crabs.
- 11. To amend **Reg. VI**, **Sec. 4(a)** and **4(e)** to lower possession limits for recreational crabbers.
- 12. To amend **Reg. I, Sec. 2(f)(3)** to remove the HS vessel replacement tag fee.

# Reg. VII, Section 5 . . . Prohibited Areas, Times and Methods of Crabbing

# Sec. 5(b) Crabbing at night Time Limits

Except person(s) using recreational dip nets and/or hand lines from the shore or a pier, it shall be unlawful for any person to take or catch crabs between sunset and one —(1) hour before sunrise, or to land or unload crabs—earlier than sunrise or later than sunset.

The Commission may from time to time and by appropriate Order, specify time of day and/or day-of-week limits for commercial crabbing. Such limit(s) may be for the entire season or only specified period(s) of time, for all or only specified life stages and/or sexes, and may be different for specific areas of the Potomac River. It shall be unlawful for any person to commercially take or harves t crabs from any commercial ge ar, or to retrieve, bait, move, pull or set any commercial gear except during the lawful time periods specified in such Order.



## **COMMERCIAL CRAB FISHERY TIME LIMITS**

**THE POTOMAC RIVER FISHERIES COMMISSION**, having found it necessary for the preservation of the blue crab population, having considered the protection, promotion, growth and conservation of the crab resources, and provisions of Regulation I, Section 7(a) and Regulation VII, Section 5(b); **HEREBY DECLARES AND ORDERS:** 

- Opt. #1
- (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to take or catch crabs between sunset and one (1) hour before sunrise, or to land or unload crabs earlier than sunrise or later than sunset.
- Opt.
- (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to commercially harvest crabs, with crab pots between 2:00 p.m. through 6:00 a.m. during the months of April, September, October and November, and between 1:00 p.m. through 5:00 a.m. during the months of May, June, July and August.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person to commercially take or catch crabs by all other gears between sunset and one (1) hour before sunrise, or to land or unload crabs earlier than sunrise or later than sunset.

**AND, IT IS FURTHER DECLARED AND ORDERED:** this Order #2008-A shall become effective July 1, 2008 and remain in effect until such time as the Commission has taken further action.

# Reg. I, Section 2 . . . License Fees - Crab

# Sec. 2(d)(3) Crab Pots Limits

Not withstanding the provisions of Regulation I, Section 2(d)(1), those persons previously holding a 300, 400, or 500 pot license, the commission may from time to time and by a ppropriate order, specify a lower limit on the number of pots that may be set per license. Such limit may be for the entire season or only specified period(s) of time, and/or for all or only specified areas of the Potomac. It shall be unlawful for the owner, captain, master, or any member of the crew of any boat licensed hereunder to set or fish more pots than the limit(s) specified under such Order. shall be limited to licenses permitting 285, 380, or 475 respectively for the calendar year 2004 and thereafter.

## COMMERCIAL CRAB FISHERY POT LIMITS

**THE POTOMAC RIVER FISHERIES COMMISSION**, having found it necessary for the preservation of the crab population, having consider ed the protection, promotion, growth and conservation of the crab resources, and provisions of Regulation I, Sec tion 7(a) and Regulation I, Section 2(d)(3); **HEREBY DECLARES AND ORDERS:** 


Opt. { (1) Those persons holding a 285, 380, or 475 pot li cense are limited to that num ber from the effective date of this Order and each year thereafter.

(1) Those persons currently holding a 285, 380, or 475 pot license shall be lim ited to setting only

Opt. 270, 360, and 450 respectively from the effective date of this Order, and each year thereafter.

(2) It shall be unlawful for any person to set or fish more than 200 crab pots in waters of the Potomac River lying upstream of the power lines at Possum Point, VA and Moss Point, MD.

**AND, IT IS FURTHER DECLARED AND ORDERED:** this Order #2008-D shall become effective July 1, 2008 and remain in effect until such time as the Commission has taken further action.

## Reg. VII, Section 4... Seasons

# Sec. 4(a) Crab Season

It shall be unlawful for any person to take or catch, or attempt to take or catch any crabs by any means in the Potomac River from December 1 through March 31 next succeeding. The Commission may from time to time and by appropriate Order, specify the crab season date(s). Such date(s) may be the same or different for various gear types, for all or only specified life stages and/or sexes. It shall be unlawful for the owner, captain, master, or any member of the crew of any boat licensed hereunder to set or fish any gear at any other time than the date (s) specified under such Order. Any crab pot, crab trot line or peeler trap found in the Potomac during such closed period, may be confiscated and disposed of by any duly authorized enforcement officer.

## Sec. 4(b) Hard & Soft Crab Season

It shall be unlawful for any person engaged in crabbing to take, catch, or possess any hard or soft crabs in the Potomac River from December 1 through March 31 next succeeding.

## Sec. 4(c) Peeler Crab Season

It shall be unlawful for any person en gaged in crabbing to take, catch, or possess any peeler crabs in the Potomac River from December 1 through March 31 next succeeding.

## **CRAB SEASON**

THE POTOMAC RIVER FISHERIES COMMISSION, having found it necessary for the preservation of the crab population, having consider ed the protection, promotion, growth and conservation of the crab resources, and pursuant to its authority under Regulatio n I, Section 7(a) and Regulation VII, Section 4, HEREBY DECLARES AND ORDERS: It shall be unlawful for any person to take or catch, or attempt to take or catch any crabs by any means in the Potomac River during the closed season(s) as follows:

- (1) Hard crabs: Males and immature females December 1 through March 31 next succeeding.

  Mature females December 1 through March 31 next succeeding.
- (2) Soft crabs December 1 through March 31 next succeeding.
- (3) Peeler crabs December 1 through March 31 next succeeding.

**IT IS FURTHER DECLARED AND ORDERED:** That it shall be unlawful to set, fish or use in the Potomac River any:


- (1) Crab pots December 1 through March 31 next succeeding.
- (2) Trotlines and dip nets December 1 through March 31 next succeeding.
- (3) Peeler traps December 1 through March 31 August 1 through April 30 next succeeding.
- (1) Hard crabs: Males and immature females November 16 through April 14 next succeeding.

  Mature females November 1 through April 14 next succeeding.
- (2) Soft crabs October 1 through April 30 next succeeding.
- (3) Peeler crabs October 1 through April 30 next succeeding.

**IT IS FURTHER DECLARED AND ORDERED:** That it shall be unlawful to set, fish or use in the Potomac River any:

- (1) Crab pots November 16 through April 14 next succeeding.
- (2) Trotlines and dip nets November 16 through April 14 next succeeding.
- (3) Peeler traps August 1 through April 30 next succeeding.

# Sec. 2(a) Size Limits (Option #A)

It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, keep in floats, or have in possession any:

- (1) hard crabs, except m ature female crabs, less than 5 inches from April 1 through July 9 and hard crabs, except mature female crabs, less than 5 ½ inches. from July 10 through the end of the season.
- (2) mature female hard crabs, greater than 6 ½ inches.
- (3)  $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$  peeler crabs less than 3 ½ inches.
- (4) (3) sponge crabs, spawn crab, blooming female crab, mother crab or the female crab from which the egg pouch or bunion has been removed of any size.

Once taken hard, peeler and soft shell crabs shall be kept separate from each other.

## Sec. 2(a) Size Limits (Option #B)

It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, keep in floats, or have in possession any:

- (1) hard crabs, except m ature female crabs, less than 5 inches from April 1 through July 9 and hard crabs, except mature female crabs, less than 5 ½ inches from July 10 through the end of the season.
- (2) peeler crabs less than 3 ½ inches
- (3) sponge crabs, spawn crab, blooming female crab, mother crab or the female crab from which the egg pouch or bunion has been removed—of any size.

The Commission may from time to time and by appropriate Order, specify crab size limits. Such limit(s) may be for the entire season or only specified period(s) of time, for all or only specified life stages and/or sexes in the Potomac River. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, sell, offer to buy or sell, expose for sale, or have in possession crabs that do not adhe re to the size limits specified in such Order. Once taken hard, peeler and soft shell crabs shall be kept separate from each other. Proposed effective date – July 1, 2008

# DRAFT ORDER 2008 - C CRAB SIZE LIMITS

**THE POTOMAC RIVER FISHERIES COMMISSION**, having found it necessary for the preservation of the blue crab population, having considered the protection, promotion, growth and conservation of the crab resources, and pursuant to its authority under Regulation I, Section 7(a) and Regulation VII, Section 2(a), **HEREBY DECLARES AND ORDERS:** That it shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, keep in floats, or have in possession any:

- (1) hard crabs, except m ature female crabs, less than 5 inches from April 1 through July 9 and hard crabs, except mature female crabs, less than 5 ½ inches. from July 10 through the end of the season.
- (2) mature female hard crabs, greater than  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inches.
- (3) peeler crabs less than 3 ½ inches.
- (4) sponge crabs, spawn crab, blooming female crab, mother crab or the female crab from which the egg pouch or bunion has been removed of any size.

Once taken hard, peeler and soft shell crabs shall be kept separate from each other.

**AND, IT IS FURTHER DECLARED AND ORDERED:** this Order #2008-C shall become effective July 1, 2008 and remain in effect until such time as the Commission has taken further action.

# Reg. I, Section 2 . . . License Fees - Commercial

# Sec. 2(d)(1) Crab Pots

For each boat or vessel used in tak ing or catching crabs with crab pots, as defined in Regulatio n VII, Section 1(a), a minimum license fee of \$135.00 valid for the use of up to 300 crab pots. A maximum number of crab pot licenses may be established from time to time by the Commission thereby making it a limited entry fishery. A license fee of \$200.00 for up to 400 cr ab pots and a license fee of \$265.00 for up to 500 crab pots shall also be available for 1995 to those persons holding a valid 1994 crab pot license. Provid ing that thereafter, such persons may continue to renew their license for the num ber of pots selected in 1995 or for a lesser num ber of pots as set forth above, but in no inst ance for more than the number of pots licensed in the preceding year. No more than one crab pot license may be issued to any person and/or for any single boat. The maximum number of pots may not exceed the num ber specified on the license. Whenever crab pots are being set, fished, or removed the license licensee must be aboard the boat or vessel and have his/her license available for inspection by an authorized enforcement officer of the State of Maryland or Virginia or agent of the Potomac River Fisheries Commission. Renewal of such license shall be pursuant to Regulation I, Section 1(c).

# Reg. I, Section 2 . . . License Fees – Commercial

## Sec. 2(d)(2) Designated Crab Pot Fisherman

A crab pot licensee may apply for a permit, for a fee of \$10, to designate another fisherman to fish his crab pots for a temporary period, subject to the following:

- (1) The licensee must provide his crab pot decal and boat number; the name, address, and date-of-birth of the designated fisherm an; and the beginning and ending dates of the period, not to exceed 14 consecutive days or more than a total of 30 days during the crab season;
- (2) The designated fisherman must use the licensee's boat to fish the licensee's crab pots during this period;
- (3) The original license and the permit must be aboard the vessel and available for inspection whenever the designated fisherman is using the license.

# Reg. VII, Section 5... Prohibited Areas, Times and Methods of Crabbing

# Sec. 5(e) Crab Pot Depth Restrictions

It shall be unlawful to place, set or fish any crab pot in waters g reater than 30 feet MLW, and in the area bounded by straight lines between the federally maintained navigational aids Red nun #10, Red nun #12, Red nun #14, Green can #13, Green can #11, a point 500 yards due north of Ragged Point Light and Red nun #10 at the point of beginning from September 1<sup>st</sup> through the end of the season.

increasing the cull ring sizes, from 2-3/16" to 2-1/2" in hard crab pots and from 1-1/2" to 2-3/16" in peeler pots and peeler traps.

# Reg. VII, Section 6... Culling of Crabs

# Sec. 6(b) Cull Rings Required

It shall be unlawful for any person to place, set or fish any crab pot, peeler pot or peeler trap in the Potomac River which does not contain the required number of unobstructed cull rings with the inside minimum diameter as specified herein:

- (i) Hard Crab Pot At least two cull rings, one of at least 2-5/16 inches and one of at least 2-3/16 2-1/2 inches in opposite exterior ver tical panels of the upper chamber of the pot. Between July 1 and April 30 next succeeding the cull rings must be unobstructed.
- (ii) Peeler Pot At least two 1-1/2 2-3/16 inch cull rings in opposite exterior vertical panels of the upper chamber of the pot.
- (iii) Peeler Trap At least four 1 ——1/2 2-3/16 inch cull ring s, one on each side o f the holding compartment and placed in such a manner as to be below mean low tide.

# Sec. 4(f) Time Limits (formerly Reg. VII, Section 5(b) Crabbing at night)

Except person(s) using recreational dip ne ts and/or hand lines from the shore or a pier, it shall be unlawful for any person to recreationally take or cat ch crabs between sunset and one (1) hour before sunrise, or to land or unload crabs earlier than sunrise or later than sunset.

# Reg. VI, Section 4 . . . Sport Crabbing

## Sec. 4(g) Female Hard Crabs Prohibited

It shall be unlawful for any person crabbing recreationally, with or without a license, to take, keep or have in possession any female hard crabs.

# Reg. VI, Section 4... Sport Crabbing

# Sec. 4(a) Exemptions w/o sport crabbing license

The taking or catching of crabs fo r sport, recreation or imm ediate household use, without a license, shall be lawful provided that no person shall in any one day take m ore than four (4) three (3) dozen hard crabs, and two (2) one (1) dozen soft crabs or peeler crabs or to exceed one (1) bushel five (5) dozen of hard crabs or three (3) two (2) dozen soft crabs or peeler crabs per boat per day by:

- (1) no more than two (2) hard crab pots fished by the owner and marked with a buoy that is easily visible on the surface and legibly displays the owner's initials in not less than one (1) inch letters;
- (2) no more than two (2) hard crab pots attached to a pier;
- (3) a single trot line per boat no longer than six hundred feet (600') marked with a buoy on each end;
- (4) no more than ten (10) collapsible crab traps per boat;
- (5) dip nets, and/or;
- (6) hand lines, but by no other means.

# Reg. VI, Section 4... Sport Crabbing

## Sec. 4(e) Harvest Limits w/ sport crabbing license

It shall be unlawful during any sing le day for any person aboard any boa t licensed under this Section 4 to remove from the Potomac River more than one (1) bushel five (5) dozen of hard crabs and two (2) dozen soft or peeler crabs, not to exceed 2 one (1) bushels of hard crabs and 4 three (3) dozen soft or peeler crabs per boat per day.

removing the HS vessel replacement tag fee from the regulation, it will be covered by the Replacement Tag Fee imposed by the Commission for all other tags (\$10.00).

# Reg. I, Section 2 . . . License Fees - Commercial

# Sec. 2(f)(3) Vessel License - HS

For each boat or vessel used in taking or catching oys ters with a hand scrape, a license fee of \$190.00. Whenever the hand scrape is abo ard the vessel the said license shall be aboard the boat or vessel and available for inspection by any authorized enforcement officer of the State of Maryland or Virginia or agent of the Potomac River Fisheries Commission. No more than one license may be issued to any one vessel for a hand scrape and no more than one hand scrape may be on board any vessel so licensed at any time. Each vessel so licensed shall be issued a set of "hand scraping" (HS) tags, which shall be firmly attached to both sides of the vessel described in the license. The tags shall be positioned on or above the hull forward but not on or near the bow, and in such a manner as to be clearly visible to passing boats. It shall be unlawful to hand scrape from any vessel not displaying said tags. A replacement set of tags will be issued for a fee of \$5.00 upon proof of loss of the original.
